According to Acadience Middle of Year Data, overall K-3 proficiency is at 75 % and 4-6 proficiency is at 79%. Acadience End of Year from 2022 overall proficiency was at 79 % a	and

4 - 6 proficiency was at 76 %. Acadience Middle of the Year Data, overall K-3 for typical or better growth is at 54% and 4-6 typical or better growth is at 64%. Acadience End of Year from 2022 overall K-3 for typical or better growth was 70%. Acadience End of Year from 2022 overall 4-6 for typical or better growth was 71%. The above data, especially the growth numbers are lower than 80%. This was the determining factor for choosing Reading as the most critical academic need. We will use the End of Year Acadience proficiency and growth scores to quantify student academic progress and success.
